Definition of Planning Area

The planning area for the Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation is the Town of Hebron Town limits, plus a four-mile fringe area. The service area for the Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation is the Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation does not stop at the Town limits, but includes a fringe area of rural users approximately four miles from the Town center. The Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation is committed to sharing facilities and programs with Town residents and rural users. The financial impact on the Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation rural users has not been studied. That said, there currently are no offsets in place for rural users that are not part of the Town tax base. The Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation welcomes users to enjoy the healthy opportunities the Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation facilities and programs has available!

Natural Features and Landscape

The landscape in the Town of Hebron is mostly flat grassland, including, hilly areas in the northwest section of the Town, with mature Red and White Oaks, Red Maples and Tulip trees.

The geology of the Town of Hebron is moderate clay composition, deep and fertile A and B horizons.

The soils in the Town of Hebron vary from sandy clay loams in the hilly northwest, to silty clay loams in the bottoms near Cobb Creek. The soils in the Town of Hebron do not limit construction or development, but care should be taken when planning construction or development in areas in or near Cobb Creek.

The topography of the Town of Hebron is highest in the southwest quadrant gradually decreasing in elevation almost fifty (50) feet moving in a northern and eastern direction. Major storm water drainage ways, due to this topography, (Dog Lake and Henderson ditches) lie at the eastern and western edges of the Town of Hebron boundary. Cobb Creek travels north and south in the Town and is located east of the Assembly Hall located at 611 N. Main Street. Cobb Creek enters the Kankakee River south of the Town of Hebron. The Kankakee River is approximately one-half mile from the Town limits.

Importance of Natural Features and Landscape

The natural features and landscape, of the Town of Hebron, describe above, are valuable assets for the existing Hebron Parks and Recreation and for the future development of open spaces, public places, lands and structures within the Town of Hebron. The flat grasslands support seven (7) neighborhood parks with play structures for young children, sports complex for organized basketball, tennis and an ice skating rink. The Town of Hebron recreation programs benefit from flat

grassland, especially, the annual Easter Egg Hunt, by allowing all ages to easily hunt for eggs. The hilly area of Town is the optimal site of the Annual Soap Box Derby. The Town water features provide an important opportunity to partner with County and other regional agencies to create an interconnected trail system that could provide a range of recreational possibilities to enhance the community.

Man-Made, Historical, and Cultural Features

Indiana State Road 2 (Main Street) serves the major north-south transportation route in the Town of Hebron. Indiana State Road 2 intersects with Indiana State Road 8 and U.S Highway 231. The State and Federal Highways encourage neighborhood parks as some perceive these highways as barriers to access to some Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation facilities. The Town of Hebron Parks has considered possible solutions to these barriers. The number and strategic placement of existing neighborhood parks in each of the three sections of the Town are solutions to this barrier. Exhibit A, Town of Hebron Parks Location Map, in the Hebron Parks Five Year Master Plan identifies Mc Millen Park and Olenik Memorial Park serving the northeast section, of the Town of Hebron, Alyea Park, Wielgus Memorial Park, and Novreske Memorial Park serving the southeast section of the Town of Hebron and the northwest/southwest section is served by Community Center Park, Cohen Park and Stagecoach Museum and Panhandle Depot Museum. The Town of Hebron Parks 'Dream' Project in the Town of Hebron Parks Five Year Master Plan is a solution to this barrier. The 'Dream" project is the creation of a consolidated central park with recreational opportunities for all ages in one location. The Town of Hebron Park Board, Council members and citizens attending the 5 Year Park Master Plan public participation sessions, believe the 'Dream" project will address this barrier.

The Town of Hebron has two Industrial Parks, commonly known as, Costin (south) and Norbeh (east) Industrial Parks, whom are the location of one of the Town's major employers. The western area of Town that is zoned industrial supports three (3) businesses.

The Valparaiso Municipal Airport, twelve (12) miles northeast of the Town of Hebron is the hub for private planes/pilots for local businesses and charter services.

Passenger rail nor business rail services are available in the Town of Hebron.

The Porter County Interim Survey of Historic Sites and Structures lists (3) 'Outstanding' Historic Structures in the Town of Hebron. These include the McCune Home, Hebron Carnegie Library and John Sigler House. The McCune Home was a way station along the stage coach route between Detroit and St. Louis. Today, the McCune Home is known as the Stage Coach Inn Historical Museum. The Town of Hebron historic Panhandle Railroad Depot was moved and

located behind the Stage Coach Inn Historical Museum to preserve the Town's railroad history.

The heart of Hebron downtown business district is at the intersection of State Road 8 and U.S. Highway 231 (commonly known as Main Street). Although the downtown has gone through many changes over the years, it still retains a few late nineteenth and early twentieth century commercial structures.

The four (4) mile fringe area outside of the Town's geographic boundary is predominantly agricultural, with over 75% of the land used for cropland, pastureland, or forest land.

Importance of Man-Made, Historical and Cultural Features

The Man-Made, Historical and Cultural features are the important building blocks of the community that exists today.

The Stage Coach Inn Historical Museum and Panhandle Railroad Depot are extremely important to the history of the Town. The Town of Hebron Parks and Recreation is charged with preserving and communicating this history to park users. Thus, the preservation of these historic structures and their history shape some of the activities of the Hebron Parks and Recreation.

Listing of Historical and Cultural Features

The Hebron Historical Society has provided countless tours and stories to interested persons about the history of Hebron. Along with stories and artifacts from pioneering in the 1800's, they have discussed the use of the railroads in that era. Many visitors from across the United States have traveled to Hebron to visit our Stagecoach Museum and Panhandle Railroad Depot.

The July 4th celebration in the Town of Hebron is an annual event that gathers the entire community together. The 4th celebration includes a parade, and a firework display sponsored by the Town of Hebron with assistance from the Hebron Chamber of Commerce. Large crowds gather for the Annual Turtle Derby race and the local American Legion #190 organization performs a fitting American Flag Raising ceremony accompanied by the Hebron School Band. In addition to the 4th celebration, The Town of Hebron holds an annual one-day 'Block' Party in September usually in one of the Town of Hebron Parks. All vendors and organizations are invited to participate regardless of their location. The Town of Hebron sponsors all utility needed for the Party, plus entertainment for the night. The Block Party has high participation and attendance, with visitors from across Northwest Indiana.

These events connect the Town residents and visitors to history and cultural of the community.

Why are these features important to your park system?

All the above described man – made, historical and cultural features help bring visitors to the Town of Hebron and the Town of Hebron parks, as well as shoppers to the local businesses. Holding events showcase our community to residents and non-residents alike about opportunities in the Town of Hebron.

Discuss how these social and economic factors in the community affect the provision of parks and recreation

When comparing the 2000 Census and the 2011-2015 American Community Survey Five (5) Year Estimates, the percentage of the community living at or below poverty level has risen from 4.2% to 15.5% and the median household income increased from \$42,103 to \$47,880 resulting in an increase of 11.3% and \$5,777, respectively. The unemployment rate in 2013 was 18.6%. The unemployment rate in 2016 was 12.7%. Thus, the unemployment rate decreased from 2013 to 2016. (2012-2016 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates) These are important factors when decisions are made regarding fees for Park Board sponsored events or activities. Most of the events and activities are free of charge affording all residents the opportunity to participate regardless of income. If a fee must be charged, the

Park Board's policy is to keep the cost as low as economically feasible to make the activity affordable to as many people as possible. Volunteer support is paramount in the Park Board's cost containment strategies.

Other options for funding existing and new facilities and equipment to modernize the Town of Hebron Parks include, but not limited to, creation of a Park Foundation, issuing bonds and or adjusting the fees and /or tax rate funding Hebron Parks and Recreation. The social and economic factors of the community suggest the Town of Hebron has the probable ability to repay bonds, support the creation of a Park Foundation and adjust tax rates and/or fees to support initiatives.

In summary, seven (7) parks have playgrounds, one (1) park has a tennis court, three (3) parks have basketball courts, three (3) parks have bleachers, five (5) parks have bike racks, three (3) parks have pavilions, two (2) parks have gazebos, two (2) parks have grills and two (2) parks have parking lots. Restroom facilities are not available at any park.

The Town of Hebron General Fund is the source of funding for the Town of Hebron Parks and annual budget.

The annual park budget for the last three years has generally remained unchanged. The three categories for annual Hebron Parks and Recreation expenses are: Programming, Park Maintenance/Supplies and Park Equipment. The Town of Hebron Park Board has successfully increased the number of park programs and replaced park equipment in recent years by implementing innovative cost-efficient improvements. For example, the Park Board ordered park benches through a plastic bottle cap collection program held the last two years. A company located in Indiana manufactured park benches from recycled plastic bottle caps at

a reduced cost to the Town. Another example, is the number of park programs held each year increased by connecting with the community for sponsorship of the programs.

As of this writing, none of the Town of Hebron Parks have any accessible routes from the entrances or outside bike/pedestrian access points to the parks, leading to any accessible features inside those Parks. As accessible park features/equipment is added to Hebron's parks, accessible routes will be constructed to facilitate the new amenities.

<u>Survey/group/individual Information:</u>

What kind of survey or interview method did you choose, and why? What date and time was the survey or interviews held?

The Hebron Park Board selected a multiple-choice survey random public input method. 1,350 surveys were inserted into the September Hebron utility bill as part of a direct mail outreach effort. An additional 260 copies of the survey were

distributed within the community as follows: 30 at Movie night 1, 30 at Movie night 2, 50 at Boone Township Schools open registration, 50 door to door by volunteers, 100 at Town Hall. The survey was posted on Survey Monkey. Special invitations were made to high school students to participate in the survey. Youth outreach efforts included a special survey for elementary school students. Surveys were accepted from August 1, 2017 through September 22, 2017. The multiple-choice survey format was chosen for versatility, ease of use and gathering of clean data that is easy to analyze. This survey format provides a fixed list of answer options yielding structured survey responses and ease of or respondents to complete in a limited amount of time. Please refer to Exhibit C for a summary of the comments gathered from the multiple – choice survey random public input method.

Stakeholder interviews were conducted as the non-random public input method. The approximately 14 stakeholder interviews were held on August 28, 2017 at the Assembly Hall, 611 N. Main Street, Hebron, IN. The Park Board chose to use stakeholder's interviews to ensure a diverse collection of opinions connecting with specific sectors of the community. Please refer to Exhibit D for a summary of the comments gathered from the non-random stakeholder interview public input method.

Surveys were advertised and distributed as follows:

- Inserted into approximately 1350 Hebron monthly utility bills
- Fliers and surveys were available in the library, businesses, etc.
- Distributed to local organizations
- Town of Hebron official website invite
- Town of Hebron and Park Board official Facebook page invite
- Direct invitations (Stakeholders)
- Survey Monkey

Stakeholder interviewees were selected by the Town of Hebron Park Board as follows:

The Park Board chose at least one person from all peer groups for the stakeholder interviews. This strategy allowed for a broad spectrum of viewpoints. Peer groups included elected officials, school staff, coaches of local sport teams, parents, business owners, Chamber of Commerce President and members of organizations such as the Lions Club.

How many members of the actual public were invited to the interviews <u>or</u> responded to your survey?

- Four hundred five (405) surveys were collected (210 online Survey Monkey surveys, 88 handwritten surveys, 107 youth handwritten surveys)
- Twenty (20) stakeholders were invited to participate in an interview





Q9 Do you feel that there is adequate parking at the Town of Hebron's parks?




Q10 Do you feel the Town of Hebron's park(s) are kept clean?


Q16 Does the town need to increase the recreation opportunities for seniors?







Q4 Have you ever ice skated at the ice rink in the Town of Hebron?






