

HEBRON STORM WATER MANAGEMENT BOARD

MINUTES OF OCTOBER 11, 2022

The Hebron Storm Water Management Board meeting October 11, 2022 was called to order by President Frank Stalbaum. In attendance were Frank Stalbaum, Walter Justice, Merle Foresman, MCO Representative Randy Decker, Attorney Brett Galvan, and Recording Secretary Joanne E. Hansen.

Minutes - On motion of Merle Foresman, seconded by Walt Justice, and duly carried 3-0 the minutes from the September 13, 2022 meeting were approved as presented. On motion of Frank Stalbaum, seconded by Walt Justice, and duly carried 3-0, the minutes from the August 9, 2022 meeting were approved with a noted correction.

Treasurer's Report - President Stalbaum read the following Treasurer's Reports.

On motion of Walt Justice, seconded by Frank Stalbaum, and duly carried 3-0, the Treasurer's Reports were approved as submitted.

Claims - On motion of Walt Justice, seconded by Frank Stalbaum, and duly carried 3-0, the Claims were approved as presented.

Public Works Report -Storm Water

- We received a complaint regarding water in the alley off Washington Street to Main Street near Goodbyes. We found a sump pump discharging water from 110 W. Sigler. We shut the water off for an hour and the sump never stopped running. We changed the meter on January 4, 2022, and found that the house has 2 cisterns and 4 pumps running. The first time we checked the water sample we had no chlorine in it but the second time we did. We will keep investigating.
- 309 S. Van Buren had a sinkhole that we ran our camera through and found that it had a small hole in the top of the tile. This tile is roughly 12 ft. deep so digging is not an option. We will explore getting this section of the pipe lined.
- The Storm Water Board met and began developing a 20-year Capital Project Plan. Chip with Abonmarche will start putting cost to each project.
- The storm water part of the CCMG has been completed. Several issues came up concerning Orange Court where they ran into a sewer lateral which resulted in using two 6-inch pipes instead of a 10-inch. The outlet replacement had a gas line in the way. At Olive Court, they hit a

water service that fed two homes and an unmarked Comcast line. Update - Randy Decker stated that this was a complete challenge, but curb work will begin on October 18th.


- The Drainage Board may want to look at increasing tapping fees. Update - Randy Decker noted that Building Inspector Brad Ladwig made a check sheet and tap fees are only \$35.00. There was a discussion regarding the review of other Town fees.
- Hawk lake retention pond was mowed and all small trees removed. Update - All cattails were mowed and ground up.

Merle Foresman inquired of the leak at Ben Butler and Bates Streets. Randy Decker stated that something will be done next week.

Old Business - None


There being nothing further before the Board, on motion of Walt Justice, seconded by Frank Stalbaum, and duly carried 3-0, the meeting was adjourned.
